Subject: Petition Asking APA to Protect Freedom of Speech and Justice for All Related to Current Listening Sessions

Dear APA Presidential Trio, APA Board of Directors, and APA Council of Representatives,

We are emailing you on behalf of Psychologists for Justice in Palestine, a collective of psychology students and professionals from diverse backgrounds who are united in solidarity with the struggle for Palestinian Liberation. We are deeply disturbed by the ongoing silencing and suppression of discussions related to Palestine within the field of psychology. **We are particularly concerned about the APA's 2007 "Resolution on Anti-Semitic and Anti-Jewish Prejudice" which has been used to obstruct efforts to promote and protect human rights — a core commitment of the Association.** For example, the Board of Directors required that Division 48 (Peace Psychology) leaders explain how a proposed statement calling for a ceasefire in Gaza was consistent with the antisemitism resolution, obstructing the statement's release. Since October 2023 and following the death of over 55,000 [Palestinians in Gaza](#) (as of June, 2025), individuals who have spoken out against violence and racism toward Palestinians have faced doxxing, arrests, threat of deportation and detention, and other threats to their livelihood. Scholars in our field have canceled or changed their engagement in conferences and other public forums out of fear of retaliation.

The 2007 APA resolution conflates antisemitism and criticism of the state of Israel, leading to silencing and repression of Palestinian voices and those addressing racism against Palestinians. The definition of antisemitism within this resolution aligns with the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) definition of antisemitism, which has been criticized by over 104 human rights and civil groups for conflating antisemitism with anti-Zionism and criticism of the state of Israel. Antisemitism should be addressed by the field of psychology, but speaking up about anti-Palestinian racism and the genocide against Palestinians being perpetuated by the state of Israel is *not* antisemitic. The current conflation in the APA resolution on antisemitism is in direct opposition to APA's Ethical Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct opposing "prejudice and discrimination based upon race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or physical condition (American Psychological Association, 2002)." Our understanding is that psychologists are ethically required to oppose such prejudice for *all* people, including Palestinians, and the weaponization of antisemitism to suppress Palestinian advocacy is a significant barrier to these efforts.

**The attached petition, which has garnered 857 individual signatures and endorsements from several APA Divisions and ethnic psychological associations, calls on the APA to reject the conflation of antisemitism with criticism of the nation-state of Israel and recognize that this conflation is discriminatory.** Signatories came from an array of backgrounds, including clinicians, graduate students, and faculty members. Many individuals

who signed the petition asked to remain anonymous, with a subsample noting fears of facing travel restrictions, facing negative consequences to their occupation/education, being targeted for pro-Palestinian activism, receiving hate mail / threats, and being accused of antisemitism, further highlighting the culture of suppression surrounding Palestinian human rights that, at this moment, the APA is upholding.

We and our signatories are requesting the following from the APA:

1. that the APA refute its endorsement of statements that are present in the [APA 2007 Resolution on Anti-Semitic and Anti-Jewish Prejudice](#) that conflate anti-Zionism with antisemitism and statements conflating criticism of the nation-state of Israel, including its [genocidal actions](#) and other violence towards Palestinians, with antisemitism
2. that the APA recognize that such [conflating] statements are, themselves, discriminatory in that they criminalize any speech or actions on behalf of Palestinian liberation and human rights, thereby enacting racial and ethnic discrimination against Palestinians
3. that the APA maintain steadfast in its opposition to true antisemitism by issuing a new or revised statement against antisemitism, integrating the distinctions between antisemitism and pro-Palestine stances discussed in the [Jerusalem Declaration on Antisemitism](#)
4. that the APA support and encourage open dialogues and discussions of the humanity, well-being, human rights, and importance of mental health for *all* people, including Jews and non-Jews, Israelis and Palestinians, citizens of the United States, and those who are citizens of other nations or who are denied citizenship anywhere in the world

This email has been sent to the APA Presidential Trio, Board of Directors, and Council of Representatives. We would be open to discussing this matter further should the APA require any additional information.

## **Petition to Urge the APA to Protect Free Speech and Justice for All**

[Psychologists for Justice in Palestine](#) calls for all psychologists, psychology graduate students, and allied mental health professionals to urge the American Psychological Association (APA) to critically review and reject the assertion that criticism of the nation-state of Israel, and particularly its [unlawful](#), decades-long oppression and violence against the Palestinian people, is antisemitic. Specifically, the APA's [2007 Resolution on Antisemitic and Anti-Jewish Prejudice](#) parallels the problematic [International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance \(IHRA\)](#) definition that defines criticism of the state of Israel and Zionism as antisemitic and discriminatory. While we strongly condemn antisemitism and anti-Jewish prejudice, we equally refuse the silencing, suppression, and hostility faced by pro-Palestinian voices and advocates when criticizing the state of Israel and its unlawful occupation in Palestine. The conflation of antisemitism with criticism of Israel serves to condone and embolden the criminalization of pro-Palestinian speech and protest, and further enables anti-Palestinian racism, anti-Indigeneity, and Islamophobia.

Over 104 human rights and civil society groups have urged the United Nations to respect human rights while simultaneously resisting antisemitism. These organizations include multiple U.S.-based organizations at the forefront of resisting racism and ensuring human rights, including the [ACLU](#), [Amnesty International](#), and Human Rights Watch. They are joined by U.S., international, and Israeli-based organizations of Jews, Muslims, Christians, Arabs, and Palestinians as well as a large number of non-denominational and non-ethnically or nationally affiliated organizations.

In their [letter](#), these organizations state:

Antisemitism is a pernicious ideology that poses real harm to Jewish communities around the world and requires meaningful action to combat it. Our organizations call on world leaders to condemn antisemitism and to take steps to protect Jewish communities, including holding perpetrators of hate crimes accountable.

Simultaneously, these organizations also call on the United Nations to reject the “working definition of antisemitism” of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA). They note:

[T]he IHRA definition has often been used to wrongly label criticism of Israel as antisemitic, and thus chill and sometimes suppress, non-violent protest, activism, and speech critical of Israel and/or Zionism, including in the U.S. and Europe.

Like IHRA, the APA resolution on antisemitism has also wrongly labeled criticism of Israel as antisemitic, including these statements:

WHEREAS this form of anti-Semitism may be asserted in the context of discourse regarding the actions of the Government of Israel, thus further disguising the anti-Semitic nature of the discourse (Anti-Semitism Worldwide, 2004); and

WHEREAS the link between extreme anti-Israel rhetoric and deeds directed against Jewish individuals and communities has become an observable global trend and has at times unleashed demonization and dehumanization of Jews; (Anti-Semitism Worldwide, 2004);

The conflation of antisemitism with criticism of Israel and/or Zionism has been used to shut down free speech and bring disciplinary and criminal charges against university students, faculty, community organizers, politicians, and [psychologists](#). Furthermore, by confounding antisemitism with anti-Zionism, the IHRA definition and the APA resolution obscure the very real instances of antisemitism that all people invested in social justice must recognize and resist.

We, psychologists and allied mental health professionals, agree with these organizations' conclusions. We furthermore agree with the arguments put forth in the letter to the UN advocating for a clearer definition of antisemitism that actively considers the possibility that some statements against Israel may, indeed, be antisemitic while others may be valid assertions of human rights for all. An example of such a definition, one that has been recommended by hundreds of scholars of antisemitism, Holocaust studies, Jewish studies, and Middle East studies, can be found in the [Jerusalem Declaration on Antisemitism](#), which integrates the distinctions between antisemitism and pro-Palestine stances.

We urge the APA to adopt a definition of antisemitism that more clearly and consistently aligns with APA's Ethical Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct opposing "prejudice and discrimination based upon race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or physical condition (American Psychological Association, 2002)." Our understanding is that psychologists are ethically required to oppose such prejudice for *all* people, including Palestinians.

Therefore, **we find the APA's conflation of antisemitism with criticism of Israel to be inherently at odds with the APA Ethics Code and related stances on human rights and justice.** We urge the APA to recognize that Palestinians and those standing in solidarity with Palestinians are enacting the central spirit of the APA Ethics code by recognizing that liberation for some cannot come at the cost of oppression of others.

We, the undersigned psychologists, psychology graduate students, and allied mental health professionals, urge the American Psychological Association (APA) and all other psychological associations to reject the rationale of the IHRA definition of antisemitism and its related prohibition against advocating for Palestinian human rights and wellbeing. For the APA specifically, we request:

1. that the APA refute its endorsement of statements that are present in the APA 2007 *Resolution on Anti-Semitic and Anti-Jewish Prejudice* that conflate anti-Zionism with antisemitism and statements conflating criticism of the nation-state of Israel, including its [genocidal actions](#) and other violence towards Palestinians, with antisemitism
2. that the APA recognize that such statements are, themselves, discriminatory in that they criminalize any speech or actions on behalf of Palestinian liberation and human rights, thereby enacting racial and ethnic discrimination against Palestinians
3. that the APA maintain steadfast in its opposition to true antisemitism by issuing a new or revised statement against antisemitism, integrating the distinctions between antisemitism and pro-Palestine stances discussed in the [Jerusalem Declaration on Antisemitism](#)
4. that the APA support and encourage open dialogues and discussions of the humanity, well-being, human rights, and importance of mental health for *all* people, including Jews and non-Jews, Israelis and Palestinians, citizens of the United States, and those who are citizens of other nations or who are denied citizenship anywhere in the world

Since the petition's initial distribution, **28 signers** revised their level of name disclosure to increase their anonymity. Specifically, **16 individuals** who initially shared their full names changed to first name only, **5** shifted from full name to anonymous, and **7** moved from first name only to anonymous. It is important to highlight that **graduate students represent a significant portion of signatories (47%)**. Of these students, **28% signed anonymously** and **40% used first names only**, meaning that the majority signed with some degree of anonymity. This pattern mirrors the broader trend among all signers, with **59% of total individual signatories** choosing to sign anonymously or using only their first name. This reflects a shared awareness of the potential personal and professional risks associated with publicly supporting justice and liberation for Palestine.
